# AAUW Santa Cruz County AAUW Funds Luncheon

The League of Women Voters will present the Pros and Cons of the six state ballot propositions for the November 4th election. This is a non-partisan explanation of state propositions with supporting and opposing arguments. The League encourages informed and active participation in government.

Two of the propositions were put on the ballot by the California Legislature, and four of them were put on the ballot by supporters who gathered sufficient signatures; of these, three are initiatives that seek to change state law and one is a referendum on an existing law.

## **Public Policy News**



If you'd like to study up on the Ballot measures in depth prior to our Oct.
25th meeting & be well prepared for the election, November 4th, please refer to your Sept. Beacon or visit the AAUW CA website (aauw-ca.org).

Proposition 1: Water Quality, Supply and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014

AAUW CA <u>supports</u> the passage of this initiative.

Proposition 2: State Budget. Budget Stabilization Account. Legislative Constitutional Amendment.

,AAUW CA remains <u>neutral</u> on this proposition.

Proposition 45: Healthcare Insurance. Rate Changes. Initiative Statute.

AAUW CA recommends an <u>oppose</u> position on Proposition 45.

Proposition 46: Drug and Alcohol Testing of Doctors. Medical Negligence Lawsuits. Initiative Statute.

Recommendation: Because AAUW supports access to quality, affordable health, it *opposes* this initiative and recommends a NO vote.

Proposition 47: Criminal Sentences. Misdemeanor Penalties. Initiative Statute.

AAUW CA recommends a <u>support</u> position on this initiative.

Proposition 48: Indian Gaming Compacts. Referendum.

AAUW CA did not study this initiative, as it is not related to the AAUW CA Public Policy Priorities.



### Get the Facts:

The gender pay gap is real, and it hurts women and families.

Among full-time, year-round workers, women are typically paid 78 percent of what men are paid.

The pay gap is worse for women of color.

When you account for all factors known to affect pay, women are still paid almost 7 percent less than men just one year after college — and the gap only grows from there.

The pay gap has barely budged in the last decade.


## **AAUW Santa Cruz Branch Interest Groups**
