Two-Minute Activist-<u>AAUW.org</u>

Take Action: Protect the hard-earned retirement savings of retirees!

AAUW strongly supports strengthening retirement benefits and programs. That's why we celebrated when, in April 2016, the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) issued its final rule to strengthen protections for retirement savers by requiring financial advisers to provide retirement investment advice that is in their clients' best interests.

But with this commonsense rule scheduled to go into effect next month, Congress and the Administration are seeking to delay and ultimately eliminate it. DOL is currently accepting comments to examine the impacts of this rule and it's critical that they hear our message:

<u>Click here to tell the Department of Labor the fiduciary rule is a necessary tool in the fight to improve our nation's retirement income security and it should be supported.</u> Women who work full time take home just 80 cents on average for every dollar men earn. Continuing pay inequity results in women having fewer savings, lower Social Security benefits, and lower pension benefits leaving them on an unequal retirement footing. This is why it is even more imperative that when women trust their retirement savings to an adviser, that the adviser puts their best interests ahead of profits.

DOL's fiduciary rule has the potential to save women and their families billions of dollars in fees every year. That's money that can now stay and compound in their retirement nest eggs.
