AAUW SC County–Membership Luncheon Honoring our Tech Trek Recipients

The Beacon

Featuring Campell Leaper, Professor and Chair of the UCSC Psychology Department and Christy Starr, Graduate Student in Developmental Psychology

Professor Leaper and Ms. Starr will address some of the reasons that girls and women remain underrepresented in many math-intensive STEM fields such as physics, engineering, and computer science.

Currently, Professor Leaper and Ms. Starr are conducting three studies related to gender and STEM. One project is examining the impact of a summer science internship program for high school students on girls' STEM motivation. A second project will consider how high school girls' involvement in STEM-related extracurricular programs may foster a sense of group belonging that supports their motivation over time. Finally, Leaper and Starr are collaborating in a project exploring how biology classroom experiences may predict undergraduate women's and underrepresented students' sense of belonging and motivation in STEM.


