STATE PUBLIC POLICY ACTION ITEM:

Take TWO Minutes for AB 1017

Tell Governor Brown to Support Fair Pay Practices

We Californians have had a tremendous year in the fight to close the gender wage gap. Senate Bill 358 (Jackson) is on the Governor's desk, and he's already pledged to sign it. SB 358 refines our Equal Pay Law (Fair Pay Act), closing loopholes that have made it difficult for employees to successfully sue about discriminatory pay. Now another important bill is on its way to the Governor, Assembly Bill 1017 (Campos), that will help prevent discriminatory pay on the front end, perhaps obviating the need for a lawsuit.

In interviewing job candidates, employers are prohibited from asking discriminatory questions such as marital status, age and if you have children. AB 1017 will extend this prohibition to asking about prior salary history.

One of the best ways to improve one's income is to make a job change. But, changing a job to escape a discriminatory salary won't work if the potential employer is able to use that old salary and give a small bump up for the new salary. In the AAUW \$tart \$mart salary negotiation workshops, attendees are advised to not discuss salary up front. However, even job applicants who've been trained to not discuss salary are thwarted if the employer requires disclosure up front. Many companies utilize electronic online applications that won't even allow the applicant to proceed in the application until the salary field is completed.

AB 1017 is a groundbreaking bill, first in the nation, that together with SB 358 (Jackson) will move California forward by leaps and bounds in closing the gender wage gap.

Thank you in advance for your willingness to help with this fight that could help not only you, but many of those around you and generations to come.

Urge Gov. Jerry Brown to support AB 1017.
