President's message:

It's hard to keep up. One minute a sex scandal, then the next enraging tweet, then an indictment, a nuclear missile test. So it'll be interesting to see how long the media maintains the current focus on sexual harassment, a subject that has long been a major cause of action for AAUW.

Anne Hedgepeth, Vice President of Public Policy for AAUW, was recently interviewed on ABC News. "In a lot of what we've been hearing, there are examples of innuendo and comments or even physical contact that could be construed as innocuous but in reality felt sexual. All of those things can add up to create a hostile climate. I know that people struggle with: at what point does it become bad enough to come forward?"

Many women (and men) have remained silent about sexual harassment and assault they've experienced, viewing this as something to be kept private, perhaps to be ashamed of, leaving them damaged goods or vulnerable to reprisal. It's hard to know how one would react, Lady Gaga says, "Til It Happens To You."

Recently actress Alyssa Milano encouraged people who'd been sexually harassed or assaulted to tweet the words #MeToo. Within a week, Twitter reported the hashtag had been tweeted over half a million times. This has helped put pressure on companies and institutions to take a harder look at the problem. With increased likelihood of exposure and public shaming, a black mark on your employment record, perhaps predators will put a brake on it. Perhaps.

Tech Trek News

Our Santa Cruz County branch has sent 7th grade girls to Tech Trek Camp Hopper at Stanford for years, beginning with just one girl. This year we hope to send six girls to Camp Hopper to further their interest in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) through hands on projects and meeting women in STEM fields.

Of course that costs money. Each girl's tuition is \$1000 with parents contributing \$50. We count on members to help with the cost, though we are fundraising from other sources.

Generous donations for Tech Trek in October came from Marla Van Cleve, Sarita Motove and Trisha Kett.

We received the first of a business outreach donation from **D'Arrigo Bros.**, **Salinas** (through **Marla Van Cleve's** efforts).

We greatly appreciate branch members sharing Tech Trek information with other businesses who would like to sponsor a girl to Camp Hopper.

Member support for the girls has grown each year. In the past you were able to contribute through National online. Now you will not be able. AAUW National informed us that TECH TREK donations should NO LONGER BE MADE ONLINE.

Tech Trekkers were busy in October beginning the county school student selection for girls to go to Camp Hopper in summer, 2018. Information was sent to each school principal and 7th grade science and math teachers describing the Tech Trek camp nomination process. Each of the Tech Trek committee members will work with a science and/or math teacher in their choice of school(s) through early 2018 to garner nominations of girls who may receive our branch scholarships. Once nominations are received from the teachers, and information from the girls, the Committee moves into high gear--reading, ranking essays and interviewing the eventual scholarship winners. Stay tuned for more from Tech Trek committee work in December's Beacon.

Stand Up for Equity in Education with GEEA

Congresswoman Patsy Mink (D-HI) forever changed the face of academia and athletics through the passage of <u>Title IX</u>, the federal law that prevents sex discrimination in education. - Supporting the work of thousands of Title IX coordinators by providing annual training and technical assistance
- Authorizing competitive grants to K-12 schools, colleges, local educational agencies, or states to support their gender equity work

Instances of sex discrimination affect the ability of all students, regardless of gender, to learn. AAUW believes that policies that allow everyone to excel are beneficial for society as a whole. We're proud of what Title IX has achieved for students—but we can do more. Urge your members of Congress stand up for equity in education by co-sponsoring GEEA now.


