President's message:

Hello, Members. Three different subjects need clarification this month.

- 1) The position of our Branch President for 2018-19 will be shared by three of our members, Mary Maier, Judy Cavin Brown, and Audrey Strayer. They've generously offered to hold the position for three months each. This slate of three will be voted in at our Membership Meeting on Saturday, April 21 at the Museum of Art and History.
- 2) Increase in Membership dues for 2018-19. The dues for 2017-18 were \$84. After ten years without an increase, AAUW National needs to up the amount by \$10 and our Branch is adding \$1. This brings the new total for AAUW membership to \$95—an increase but still an amazing bargain at 26 cents a day! You'll be supporting the nation's leading group for women's rights and have a local community for friendship and stimulation. Get involved. We're fun! We do important things.
- 3) The AAUW National is proposing three amendments to their Bylaws to be voted on by the entire membership.
 i) create three-year staggered board terms at National level ii) open National board positions to those outside of the AAUW membership,
- iii) eliminate college degree requirement for membership in AAUW..."

This third proposed amendment generates the most discussion among our Branch members. One of AAUW's primary goals is to advance education for women. Currently membership in AAUW requires a college degree, or an AA degree from a Junior College, or a professional degree such as Registered Nurse, etc. Be sure to think about this measure and cast your vote accordingly. You can comment on the proposed changes until April 24 at https://www.aauw.org/resource/national-election/.

It's important that our Branch members vote. AAUW has done a great job of making online voting extremely easy. Usually all it take is a few clicks on their website.

Voting begins on April 25 and closes June 9. In the next few weeks, you'll be getting a logon PIN in an email. Please be on the lookout for it and please vote! It's easy. It's important. Thank you.

The girls shared with us their interest in math and science explaining what they would do to change the world. The six girls selected are: Samantha Rubio, E.A.Hall Middle School; Brooklyn Llamas, Lakeview Middle School, Zoe Nguyen, Mission Middle School, Madeline Petersen, New Brighton Middle School, Chloe Millar, Aptos Middle School and Grace Shipp, San Lorenzo Valley Middle School.


