

President's Message

This is the last issue of The Beacon for the season, my last President's Message, and a good time to review our Branch's accomplishments. The Board and Committee members worked hard this year to strengthen the Santa Cruz County Branch and to make AAUW more visible to the larger community.

Our results? We co-sponsored two well-attended community events with the League of Women Voters on *Human Trafficking and Distinguishing Fact in the Media from Fake News*.

Our **End Human Trafficking Committee** works with the District Attorney's office to get rescue information to victims of trafficking. They have an upcoming event, open to the public, to help end the exploitation of children: October 20th, 2018, Saturday 1-4. "Chosen: The True Story of America's Teen Trafficking." A panel of local experts will address local trafficking concerns. Our committee, led by Martha Mangan with Kit Hein, needs your help with refreshments for the event. Our Local Scholarship Committee awarded eleven scholarships to women re-entering Cabrillo College and women going on to four year colleges, this year to UCSC. One of AAUW's primary goals is furthering the education of women and this committee's work has been outstanding. Our gratitude and the community's gratitude go to Jeanne Jorgensen, Dorothy Patrick, Jane Amaral, and their many assistants.

Kris Sheehan reports that our **Tech Trek Committee** had had "fabulous" response and generous support from our Branch members. They report a solid beginning for Tech Trek 2019. For 2018 our Branch of AAUW, Santa Cruz County, is sending **six** girls to the STEM Tech Trek camp this summer at Stanford University. This is a major accomplishment, surpassing many of the larger Branches, and we thank Kris Sheehan and her committee.

We thank all of our Board Members. This is an amazing group of women, volunteers, who show up and work hard to make it all happen. And to have many good laughs in the process.

We are justifiably proud of our Branch's accomplishments. I'm pleased to tell you that AAUW at the California State Level is also very impressed with our Branch.

It's with great pleasure I report that the California American Association of University Women has recognized our Santa Cruz County Branch, awarding us a Certificate of Recognition for our "outstanding Mission-based program." The National Headquarters for AAUW is proposing three amendments to their Bylaws to be voted on by the entire membership.

- 1) create three-year staggered board terms for National
- 2) open National board positions to those outside of the AAUW membership,
- 3) eliminate college degree requirement for membership..."

This third amendment generates the most discussion among our Branch members. One of AAUW's primary goals is to advance education for women. Currently membership in AAUW requires a college degree, or an AA degree from a Junior College, or a professional degree such as Registered Nurse, etc. Be sure to think about this measure and cast your vote accordingly.

It's important that our Branch members vote. AAUW has done a great job of making online voting extremely easy. Usually all it take is a few clicks on their website.


Human Trafficking Committee News
