A FREE COMMUNITY FORUM

Please join us in our efforts to #End Human Trafficking.

Santa Cruz County AAUW and Scroptimists International Capitola by-the-Sea are presenting a free public forum to educate and inform about the dangers of human trafficking in our local community.

Focusing on the dangers to our youth, this year's forum will include keynote speaker Catie Hart, co-founder of the Safe and Sound program, who "...strive(s) to empower people to stay safe, to be compassionate to those affected by trafficking, and to better understand that we must all heal together if we are to lessen the problem." Deborah Pembrook, Leader Survivor, from the Coalition to End Human Trafficking in Santa Cruz and Monterey Counties, will speak on the history of HT in our community, the problems and solutions. A panel of local agencies, including the district attorney's office, Monarch Services, and the County Office of Education will discuss efforts to identify, educate and protect our youth. There will also be an art contest with cash prizes for local high school students.

Light refreshments will be served, as well as an opportunity drawing for prizes donated by local merchants.

Celebrating the Centennial of Women's Suffrage at the Annual Monterey Bay Interbranch Council Luncheon

Guest speaker: Angelica Shirley Carpenter

Angelica Carpenter is the author of the book Born Criminal: Matilda Joslyn Gage, Radical Feminist. She will tell us all about Matilda Joslyn Gage (1826-1898) who was a feminist leader, writer, conference organizer and specialist in civil disobedience. She changed the course of history. For decades she worked with Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, but she was more liberal than they were, fighting for equal rights not dependent on sex, race, class, or creed. Gage also served as a writing mentor to her son-in-law, L. Frank Baum, who later wrote The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, about a strong American heroine. Carpenter explores Gage's life, including her rise and fall within the women's movement she helped build.
