Guest speaker: Angelica Shirley Carpenter

Angelica Carpenter is the author of the book Born Criminal: Matilda Joslyn Gage, Radical Feminist. She will tell us all about Matilda Joslyn Gage (1826-1898) who was a feminist leader, writer, conference organizer and specialist in civil disobedience. She changed the course of history. For decades she worked with Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, but she was more liberal than they were, fighting for equal rights not dependent on sex, race, class, or creed. Gage also served as a writing mentor to her son-in-law, L. Frank Baum, who later wrote The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, about a strong American heroine. Carpenter explores Gage's life, including her rise and fall within the women's movement she helped build.

I couldn't have said it better myself. Our state convention will be an important event for all our members, and we hope you will join us for this important weekend.



In case you missed this year's Tournament of Roses Parade, we thought you might enjoy seeing the float that was made by Pasadena Celebrates 2020. The float, entitled "Years of Hope, Years of Suffrage," portrayed the long period of history it took to win the right to vote. Standing on the float were descendants of suffragists; and behind it, women of Pasadena dressed in white holding purple signs that read "Votes for Women." Their float won the Theme award. The overall parade theme was: *The Power of Hope*.

Local Scholarships News

Thanks again to all who attended our annual Holiday luncheon; it was, as usual, a lovely event and a great success. We added nearly \$15,800 to our account based on raffle sales and generous donations. Our Foundation statement from UCSC came to us recently and our account has grown from \$47,873 for last year to \$49,566 for this year. Interest earned is matched with our funds to award the scholarships we give out each year. At Cabrillo we have two funds, the Carol Symonds Fund which is worth \$15,000 and an unendowed fund begun by the Watsonville Branch which is worth \$55,264.

Don't forget to mark your calendars for our Scholarship luncheon in May. It will be on Saturday, May 14th, at Seascape Resort. We will hear from many of our recipients of scholarships that your generosity has made possible.

Here it is a New Year, new decade! The last one zipped by so fast and I am not sure I am ready for the next one yet.

Our TT Committee will meet in early January to follow up the preliminary information sent to the 7th grade Science and Math teachers in November.

We will ask the contacted teachers to nominate up to three 7th grade girls from each school who have a passion for science, technology, engineering or math (STEM). We will send applications to the nominated girls for their completion and submission in mid February.

Once received, our committee will read and rank all the applications and essays and select a number of girls for interviews in March. Final selection for the Tech Trek 2020 attendees is made following the interviews.

Our annual Tech Trek request letter went to all members, before the Christmas holidays. We are extremely grateful for donations from Anne Sherwood, Audrey Strayer, Barbara Lewis, Kit Hein, Sarita Motove, Joan Schwimmer, Rosemary Anderson, Patricia Clark, Jeanne Jorgensen, Andrea Losee, Lorraine Margon and Jean Gregson.

Your donations are so very appreciated. We are halfway there!!! Money for the camp is due in March. As a reminder, each girl sent to camp in the summer is fully paid for by our Members. The cost per girl for camp is \$1000. Any donation for the 2020 Tech Trek girls is helpful.


