Guest speaker: Angelica Shirley Carpenter

Angelica Carpenter is the author of the book Born Criminal: Matilda Joslyn Gage, Radical Feminist. She will tell us all about Matilda Joslyn Gage (1826-1898) who was a feminist leader, writer, conference organizer and specialist in civil disobedience. She changed the course of history. For decades she worked with Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, but she was more liberal than they were, fighting for equal rights not dependent on sex, race, class, or creed. Gage also served as a writing mentor to her son-in-law, L. Frank Baum, who later wrote The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, about a strong American heroine. Carpenter explores Gage's life, including her rise and fall within the women's movement she helped build.

# Tech Trek News

Happy February!!

We want to keep our members up to date with our 2020 Tech Trek Selection Process.

Nominations for 7th grade girls interested in STEM have been requested from Santa Cruz County middle schools' Science and Math teachers.

Following receipt of nominations from teachers for up to three girls per school, applications are sent to the girls for completion.

The application includes a number of questions about the girl's school and extracurricular interests. An essay of 400-500 words is also required. The essay question asks the student to share one specific thing in the area of science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) that fascinates her. She is to explain what makes it so interesting to her, how she first come to learn about it and what she has done to learn even more about it over time.

Our Committee will be reviewing the completed applications as they are submitted. We will then finalize which girls will be interviewed in March, with final selection taking place in early April.

We are very appreciative of every member's generosity to the Tech Trek program. We have received donations this month from Phyllis Taylor, Darby Kremers, Vicki Birdsall and Jane Amaral.

We are getting closer to completing our 2020 Tech Trek Camp fundraising goal. Tuition for each of the five girls selected is \$1000.



# AAUW Fund News

The AAUW donation year is January-December, even though the branch leadership serves July-June. Therefore we will soon have an "end of year" announcement about branch giving in 2019. Donations to AAUW Fund are used to support the mission of AAUW in many ways, including projects, workshops, and promotion of our public policy. The current strategic goals are to 1) Remove bias from education, 2) Fight for fair pay and economic equity, and 3) Advance women in leadership.

As one recent example: to advance awareness of the economic issues women face, AAUW conducted research specifically about workplace sexual harassment. The resulting report also includes a description of the limits of current legal remedies, and a suggested action plan. Here is more information about this issue:



### **How Sexual Harassment Limits Our Livelihoods**

New research from AAUWfinds that workplace sexual harassment can take a toll on women's physical and mental health and reduce their lifetime earnings. The report is based on an AAUW analysis of Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) data, a review of academic studies on sexual harassment and an exclusive nationwide survey of AAUW members and their networks.

It shows that the experience of sexual harassment is not often one that women can quickly put behind them. Rather, its impact continues to reverberate throughout their lives, increasing their risk of depression, post-traumatic stress disorder and other long-term health problems. And that's not to mention the financial repercussions: In AAUW's survey of 311 women, 38% of women who'd been harassed said it contributed to their decision to leave a job early, and 37% said it disrupted their career advancement. The report includes harrowing stories like this one from Maria, 53: "I was working as an office manager in a small business, and the boss/owner was the one harassing me. There was no one else to report it to. I ended up quitting."


