In a recent email, Board Chair Julia Brown spelled out more specifically what the current plans are for use of these funds. In case you missed it, here is the list:

This #GivingTuesday, donate to support five key goals:

- 1. Push Congress to **pass long-delayed COVID relief** to the millions of Americans and families who lost jobs and benefits, most of whom are women and people of color.
- 2. With Betsy DeVos exiting as Secretary of Education in January, reverse the damage she did by reinstating Title IX provisions to **protect women and girls from harassment and unequal educations**.
- 3. In the midst of our nation's overdue reckoning with racism, **prioritize equal compensation and opportunities for Black women and Latinas**, who have the widest pay gaps.

- **5.** Build on the gains women and women of color made to elected office by dramatically increasing women leaders in every sector.

## Tech Trek News

Finally good news going into December, that various vaccines may be available soon! Hope you all stay well and have the vaccine when you are offered it, and wish to take it.

Of course, very importantly, continue to wear your mask and socially distance. Join us for the Holiday Zoom and have a lovely holiday with the friends and/or loved ones that you are able.

As you may remember, because of the virus Tech Trek did not have residential camp at Stanford last year. Nor will there be a residential camp this year.

Last year the San Diego Branch partnered with Qualcom with a Robotics camp participated in by 40 girls in that area. It was deemed successful and will now be offered statewide as a Tech Trek Virtual Camp.

As the Virtual Camp Week is still being developed, a Zoom meeting was scheduled last Thursday with the state Virtual Camp Director, Mary Isaac who provided some details about what the California AAUW Tech Trek Virtual Camp is to be this year.

There are to be at least three camps, late June and twice in July for 288 girls at a time. The Qualcom Robotics program developed and used last summer is scheduled for each of four mornings. Following a lunch break, one required 90 minute workshop and one optional workshop created with STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) in mind, will be available. Friday will be a presentation day for parents and each other. Those girls completing the required 15 hours of class time will receive a certificate There are still issues to be resolved for Santa Cruz County girls to participate.

- Will a virtual camp be of interest to girls who have been in front of screens all year?
- As Robotics is the emphasis of the camp, will it appeal to girls who want a different STEM opportunity?
- Connectivity issues will need to be resolved for the girls that may be selected.
- Our schools use Chrome Books. They do not work with the Qualcom program. Qualcom is working on a solution, but have not guaranteed it will be completed by camp.
- Teacher Nomination of 2021 7th grade girls will not be until January. The required Application will be updated for the Virtual Camp. Details have not been finalized as to how the girls might be chosen, or apply.

- There was concern about being able to use funds on deposit from last year's camp for this year. In the current Board to Board email FAQ it appears that previously deposited funds will be able to be used.
- In 2019 we had selected 15 girls to interview in March. That did not happen.

Another ongoing issue for our committee was what we might be able to do for the girls chosen from last year. There may be a chance to send them to this virtual camp.

 The state director has said that no branch needs to participate in the virtual camp, but may mentor past TT and current 7th graders in a STEM program if they wish.

Virtual Camp marketing materials are currently being developed to share with teachers and potential campers explaining the camp. The materials are to be available by the first of the year.

Our Committee will be meeting Thursday to discuss the Virtual Camp and STEM opportunities available for Santa Cruz girls.

Our Tech Trek Committee continues to support Danika Marlet, who, In our latest email exchange, shared that her Soquel High group Women in Science recently connected with WiSE. "We had a career panel two weeks ago and it went fantastic! All of the research they conduct is fascinating and my club and I were able to ask some great questions. In fact, we are scheduling another panel in January!" Danika is a great example of a Tech Trek seed planted that has sprouted! It is wonderful to see her pursuing opportunities in STEM.

If any of you would like to be a part of helping young women in their STEM journey, please let us know. Can you share your STEM experience, or do you know of someone who can? Do you know of a volunteer project in the STEM area that a middle school or high school girl might be a part of? All ideas are welcome.

### **Public Policy News**

This timely and informative article originally appeared in the AAUW Danville-Alamo-Walnut Creek Branch newsletter (December 2020 issue). It is reprinted here with permission.

Our election is over, and people turned out in massive numbers to vote. The voting process has been declared fraud-free, the Electoral College met in December and certified state's votes. It is anticipated that President elect, Joe Biden, will take the oath of office in January.

#### What's next?

<u>December 14, 2020</u> Each state's certified results will be reflected in the votes taken by the Electoral College.

<u>December 23, 2020</u> Congress will receive the results from the Electoral College. Because the U. S. Supreme Court unanimously ruled against faithless Electors, the Electors are expected to vote according to the popular vote in their respective states.

January 3, 2021 The 117th Congress will be sworn into office.

January 6, 2021 Congress will count the electoral votes and certify the winner. The candidate team with 270+ electoral votes will be declared President and Vice-president.

January 20, 2021 We anticipate that Joe Biden and Kamala Harris will be sworn into office.

### Vice President

Our own Californian, Kamala Harris, will be the first woman, the first Black, and the first South Asian American to serve. Harris has been a leader in legislative reform as Attorney General in our state and has spoken often about the disproportionate effect of coronavirus on Black and Brown communities. Her early beginnings in Oakland/Berkeley sowed the seeds of her civil rights and social justice reforms. Her recent book, "We Hold These Truths" provides a good window into the background and motivations of this truly remarkable woman. Her new role creates an opening for a new U. S. Senator from California. Prospective picks include Barbara Lee, Alex Padilla, Xavier Becerra, and Libby Schaff.

#### AAUW supports a peaceful transition

AAUW joins with the World Justice Project in supporting the rule of law and peaceful acceptance of election results as stated in the "A Joint Appeal to Protect the Rule of Law in the 2020 U.S. Elections:" We urge those in leadership positions to encourage peaceful participation in the election Process and to condemn any threats or acts of violence. We also urge all Americans to exercise patience, civility, and restraint, so that the results of the elections can be determined in accordance with the rule of law and peacefully accepted by the American people.

#### Call to Action

Make your voice heard in the halls of our representatives. We deserve a peaceful and smooth transition. We deserve a coordinated and adequate response to the pandemic and we deserve a chance to issue stimulus help to the many people who have lost their jobs. Let's urge our representatives to do the right thing by our democracy and nation.
