Please join us at the Annual Tech Trek Luncheon, organized by our Tech Trek Committee. Not only will you be served a tasty three-course lunch, but you will enjoy our Keynote Speaker Team and be introduced to the Middle School Girls our branch funded and sent to Camp Carson in July.



Tech Trek's Camp Carson at UC Santa Cruz is a week-long residential camp during which 80 middle school girls are immersed in all things STEM. (STEM = Science, Technology, Engineering and Math). Tech Trek Camp gives these girls inspiration and builds confidence in pursuing future STEM-related careers.

SPEAKERS: Members of our Keynote Speaker Team are all aeronautical engineers and hail from <u>Joby Aviation</u>. They are Emma Schneider, Gillian Blumer, and Marissa Moehring. They will speak to us about why experiences like Tech Trek are so important.

Joby is working on emerging technology in a specialized sector of the aviation market. They are building electric helicopter taxis that vertically takeoff and fly 200 mph. This aircraft field called eVTOL, for Electric Vertical Takeoff and Landing, is being developed in Santa Cruz--our own backyard--plus in Marina, other U.S. locations, and countries afar.

Tech Trek 2025 campers will join us and share their experiences at camp by explaining why it was such a special opportunity for them.

We'll also hear from Iris Frank of the Pajaro Valley Quilt Association (PVQA). Iris led the group of quilters who made 100 STEM-related quilts so that each Tech Trek camper received one! Wow!


